Heading to a Combat Zone? Use Your Entitlements.

Designated Direct Support Area — Review the DFAS list of **Designated Direct Support Areas of** a Combat Zone (CZ) to determine your eligibility.

Special Leave Accrual (SLA) — Servicemembers serving in a Hostile Fire Pay/Imminent Danger Pay (HFP/IDP) area for a continuous period of at least 120 days may retain and accumulate up to 120 days of leave.

Servicemember's Civil Relief Act (SCRA) -Review protections you have and request records as a servicemember called to Active Duty.

Servicemembers' Group Life Insurance (SGLI) all monthly premium deductions are reimbursed for servicemembers serving in a designated CZ or direct support area.

Rest & Recuperation Leave (R&R) — Servicemembers deployed to certain locations for specific periods of time are eligible for R&R leave at the commander's discretion, with the possibility of paid travel expenses.

Thrift Savings Plan (TSP) — Contributions are tax exempt for those deployed in a designated CZ or direct support area.
